Our History

The International Council of Women was founded in Washington in 1888, by delegates from Canada, the United States, Great Britain, France, Norway, Denmark and India. In 1893, Lady Aberdeen, International President and wife of Canada’s Governor General, was instrumental in establishing the National Council of Women of Canada.

Western Canada has traditionally produced women, committed to their communities, who take leadership roles to improve the quality of life for families. In 1894, ten Winnipeg Women’s groups formed one of the first Local Councils of Women in Canada.

Recently, in partnership with the Council of Women of Winnipeg, we sponsored the *Celebrating Women* Art Display, honouring the passion, pride and perseverance of Canadian Women. Proceeds are directed towards the many challenges women continue to face particularly the ongoing issues of homelessness and personal safety.

We take Action!

- September 2003, we spoke to the Standing Senate Committee on Human Rights on the key legal and social issues affecting on-reserve matrimonial property with the breakdown of a marriage or common law relationship.
- In 2004-2005, we spoke out about the decision and the process to amend Plan Winnipeg and begin a huge development in South West Winnipeg – Waverley West. We made presentations, did research, worked with others to urge governments to begin a comprehensive Plan Winnipeg review.
- October, 2007, we presented our Brief to the provincial NDP Caucus and Opposition Parties
- In May, 2009, we co hosted the launch of the documentary, *The Way We See It*, in support of individuals who live with mental illness, and their families

Our Strengths

- There is strength in numbers and unity. Federate groups sharing a common interest in issues have the opportunity to grow through networking with other member organizations.
- An inclusive, diverse, independent and objective organization with a focus on serving the interest of women, families and communities.
